The Board of Commissioners monthly meeting was held at 1830 on Thursday March 10, 2016 at Station 49, 12131 228th Street NE Arlington, WA 98223.

- **Spring Retreat** Decision made to postpone discussion for next regularly scheduled workshop.
- City of Arlington Discussion regarding the City of Arlington workshop scheduled to review FCS study results on March 24, 2016.

Discussion regarding solicitation to Snohomish County EMS Council for possible transfer of BLS transport license from Monroe speedway to District 21. The State acknowledges our transport agreement with District 22 and desire to have our own BLS Transport license for District 21. If we cannot procure license from speedway, current needs assessment will be issued through Snohomish EMS Council, North Regional Council, and then onto State for approval. 2013 data provided

information reflecting that the City of Arlington is getting a very good deal and the supporting documentation found that District 21 is grossly overpaying.

Discussion regarding the fact that we are a growing fire department and enhancing community service. Proposed 70/30 split is nearly \$2,200 per call for District 21.

Review 2015 data from current records management system and other districts:

Snohomish County cost per call analysis:

District 21 \$1,988.26 (City of Arlington's proposal)

Silvana \$ 783.02

Lake Roesiger \$1,000.00

Monore \$ 877.50

Darrington \$ 458.00

County average \$543.07

Approximately 587 Mutual aid responses were provided to the City of Arlington in 2015 from neighboring districts at no cost.

Discussion regarding unfair reciprocity as seen through increased wait times and delayed transports. The City of Arlington is supposed to be responding to our District and we're seeing others dispatched which is taking much longer and not providing our citizens with the care and service they deserve. Our District feels as though we are stuck in a bureaucracy as we wait to get a transport license so that we can better serve our community.

Discussion regarding transport billing fees; County fire departments bill patients when they are transported to the hospital. The City of Arlington bills District 21 and the patient an additional \$1,000.00 per transport which equates to the highest in the county (with the exception of private ambulance service).

Negotiations with the City of Arlington continue. Decision made to proceed with issuing additional payment in good faith, although previous payments have not been cashed and are still being held by the City of Arlington. Delays continue in obtaining FCS study results.

The City of Arlington continues to provide BLS transport services within the boundaries of the District beyond December 31, 2015 without our consent; as stated in our legal counsel's letter to the Arlington City attorney dated December 24, 2015.

- BLS Transports Pending City of Arlington negotiations. Discussion regarding the assignment of ALS & BLS transport licenses by region. Our local EMS Council performs needs assessment, Regional Council evaluates the assessment and sends it onto State committee for approval. If we are not able to secure the transport license from Monroe Speedway then we will proceed with obtaining one from the State by demonstrated need. We continue to advocate for and protect the needs of our citizens. We're ready provide transport services; we have the software, hardware, new ambulance, and capacity here to provide this much needed service for our citizens.
- New World AIQ Discussion regarding percentage of transports into Everett that are getting routed
 to another call; if unit is the closest available the expectation is to respond and assist as able.

Captain positions will be appointed in the near future.

 - Hovercraft piolet training Assistant Chief Bates, Assistnat Chief Stocker, Captain Marty & Firefighter Kraski completed Neoteric training on piloting machine, routine maintenance & repairs.

 - South Side District Property 3 property owners contacted on South side of District; currently have one interested party. Road test times are being evaluated.
